


Ministry IMPACT REPORT





TRAINING

In 2025, approximately 16 leadership programs were conducted in 10 of the 12 countries we serve, equipping men and women with biblical understanding, servant-leadership skills, and practical ministry tools.

Through AH programs such as Pastor and Leader Trainings, Women's Leadership Training, and Marriage Counseling Workshops, as well as locally-led ministry trainings, over 1,000 participants experienced spiritual growth, discipleship, and fellowship, strengthening their pastoral networks and ensuring a resilient church presence in regions facing persecution. Each cohort continues to multiply impact by empowering leaders who equip others, rooting the Church deeply in God's Word and preparing faithful leaders for the generations to come.

RELIEF

This year, churches across the MENA region continued to bring healing and hope amid conflict, displacement, poverty, and disaster. Food distributions, medical aid, and essential items like clothing and winter supplies offered a lifeline for the most vulnerable—refugees, children, widows, and the elderly. Our partner churches served over 12,000 families, meeting urgent needs while sharing the Gospel. These efforts provided more than aid; they built trust, opened doors for ministry, and revealed Christ's love in action.

Our medical clinic continued its vital work, caring for up to 500-900 patients a month with compassion and prayer.

One pastor serving a refugee community exemplified this dedication. He and his wife spent countless hours at their relief front, serving, visiting families in tents and temporary homes, offering comfort, prayer, and the hope of Christ. Their perseverance mirrors that of many frontline leaders serving in the hardest places.

As restrictions eased, new distribution channels opened, and opportunities grew—not only for food aid but for rebuilding communities and fostering long-term sustainability. Despite logistical challenges, the Lord provided.

EVANGELISM

We supported 42 frontline pastors and church leaders serving faithfully in some of the region's most spiritually unreached and challenging areas. These indigenous leaders are uniquely equipped to share the hope of Christ through home visits, discipleship groups, evangelistic events, and follow-up from relief and education outreach.

In 2025, through their partnership and outreach, more than 208,000 people heard the Gospel. Evangelism took many forms—public preaching at festivals, quiet conversations in homes, and small-group discipleship—but the message remained the same: Jesus Christ is Lord, and His love transforms lives. From North Africa to Pakistan, we witnessed that power firsthand:

A former Islamic leader, who had written over forty books urging Muslims to convert Christians, encountered the Living God while reading *Isaiah 61*—transforming his life forever. And near Faisalabad, when a young Christian was killed for sharing the Gospel, our partners turned grief into prayer and pressed on with renewed courage. Despite hardship, persecution, and instability, the Church continues to grow.

EDUCATION

Ananias House supported eight schools reaching approximately 2,076 students across the MENA region providing quality education, spiritual formation, and safe environments for children from marginalized, refugee, and impoverished backgrounds. In addition to core academics, students received biblical teaching, emotional support, and mentorship from Christian teachers, and in some instances, exposure to vocational and enrichment programs such as carpentry, hairdressing, auto repair, and music and fine arts.

The message of Christ is woven into every classroom, relationship, and lesson. Teachers live out their faith before the students, many of whom come from non-Christian backgrounds, showing them what it means to follow Jesus. These efforts ensure long-term transformation by investing in the next generation of leaders, peacemakers, and believers.


